## Wednesday Lenten Soup & Supper

During the five Wednesdays of Lent, beginning February 21 and ending March 21, from 6pm-8pm we will be gathering in the Parish Hall for soup at 6pm, followed directly by our Lenten programs for adults and children, and then a short Eucharist together at 7:30pm.

The adult program we are using this year is called "Meeting Jesus in the Gospel of John" it was produced by Virginia Theological Seminary and the Society of St. John the Evangelist (an Episcopal monastic group). As we read passages from John, and discuss our thoughts and lives, we will be drawn deeper into the journey of Lent. The youth are invited to participate in the adult program, and will break out into their own small group for discussion. Or if they would prefer, they can join the children's program as helpers.

A children's program (ages 3-11) will happen at the same time as the adult program. It is a Godly Play story about Jesus' ministry called "The Greatest Parable" which will play out over the five weeks, building each week. It is a new story series our children have not experienced before!

Nursery care will be available for babies and children under 3. We look forward to this time together during this season.



Other helpful skills: Working with company financials; Digital/online marketing professional; Experience promoting family programs (sports, theater, camp, entertainment).


Hobbies/interests: Coaching sports (youth base-ball and basketball); Writing and reading (published poet and freelance writer); Meditation and spiritual development.

please let Revs. Robin or Rachel know you hope to join so we are sure we have enough materials for everyone.


## **Practicing Lenten Faith at Home**

### **Episcopal Questions, Episcopal Answers: Adult Inquirer's Class!**

Are you new to church or new to St. Cross or the Episcopal church? Have you been part of St. Cross for 5, 10, or 50+ years, yet would like a refresher about our life and faith? Are you desiring a formal declaration of your faith in the form of confirmation, reception, or the reaffirmation of your baptismal vows? If you answered yes to any of these questions, I invite you to consider joining our upcoming adult education offering.



The course will cover the basic foundations of the Christian tradition as we have received it in the Episcopal Church. Class topics include:

Journey, Scripture, Sacraments, Belief, Prayer and more. It will be a great opportunity to renew the foundations of our Episcopal faith and it can also serve as the preparation to be confirmed, reaffirm your vows made at baptism, or be received (if you were confirmed in another tradition, but would like to be formally recognized as a member of the Episcopal Church). That will formally occur when our Diocesan Bishop John H. Taylor visits us at St. Cross on Sunday, April 29, 2018.

The course will consist of 8 sessions beginning on the first Sunday of Lent, Feb 18th, and will stretch into the season of Easter and conclude on Sunday, April 22nd (off on 3/25, Palm Sunday, and 4/1, Easter Sunday). It will be taught by Rev. Rachel, Rev. Robin, and myself and we will use our base text a resource called Episcopal Questions, Episcopal Answers: Exploring Christian Faith by Ian S. Markham and C.K. Robertson. Each session will be held in Room #4 and will begin at 9AM sharp.


The Great Litany is a long intercessory prayer addressed to Jesus and composed of many, many, wersicles (sung by the cantor) and responses (sung by the choir and congregation). Litanies date back to the early years of the church and were also used in public processions. Anglicans honor Archbishop Cranmer for creating the Great Litany as the first liturgical text written in English for Henry VIII in the 1540s.


