...by coming to the St. Cross Annual Meeting on January 28!

I realize that the Annual Meeting isn't something that everyone marks into their calen-

dar the way they may the date of the pageant, Holy Week or Easter Sunday. However, I am going to encourage you to do so this year as the Vestry and I have big and exciting news to share

with you, including how we see St. Cross now and how we envision St. Cross for future generations. Sunday, January 28 in the parish hall after the 10 am service.

The Annual Meeting is required by our bylaws

and has several functions:

1) It is when we elected new Vestry members to serve, and say goodbye and thank those who are ending their three years of service on the board. Your Vestry is responsible for the budget for St. Cross, our stewardship of money and of our church plant as a whole.



2) It is when we elect parishioners to represent our parish at the Diocesan Convention next December. At this convention they vote on policy and budget for our diocese as a whole.

3) It is when we present the budget to be read (not voted on, as that is the Vestry's job) by the

congregation to see how we did last year and what are our plans for next year.

- 4) It is when we make by-law changes if we need to for our endowments (luckily our church by-laws are up to date!!)
- 5) It is when you can pick up an annual report. Each committee and ministry at St. Cross submits a report for the annual report that is a review of prayerful work accomplished in the past year.

Know Your AEDs

The AED – Automated External Defibrillator

The St. Cross emergency team recently presented a short AED training in Parker Hall, led by Jeanne Hendricks of Manhattan Beach CERT. The training was fantastic, and we are working on more emergency trainings soon!



For those who were unable to make the training, know that we will attempt to schedule another in the near future. Also, here is a quick recap of what we learned at the training:

◆ The AED is located just inside the northeast door of Parker Hall, to your left as you enter.

When you are asked to bring the AED...

- Open the door on the cabinet unit...take AED, child pads, extra adult pads, and the pouch below AED to wherever the medical emergency is.
- If you know the victim is not breathing, make direct eye contact with a person and instruct him or her to call 911.
- If the condition of the patient is not known, close the door to quiet the alarm, and immediately return to the victim with the AED and supplies. The first responder working with the patient will determine if 911 should be called.

To use the AED...

- Open the unit, and press the green button on the upper right.
- ♦ Listen and follow the instructions exactly!
- ◆ Search YouTube for "Philips HeartStart OnSite AED" as this video gives a great overview
- Assuming there are other people to help you, one person should be doing compressions and you, or another designated AED user, should be working around the person doing the compressions to activate the AED.

Thank You from Las Familias Del Pueblo

Dear St. Cross,

Thank you for your generous grant of \$2,587.96 to purchase food for the children. We placed the grant in a restricted fund we call the St. Cross Fund for Food for the Children.

Las Familias' after-school and out-of-school programs serve some of Los Angeles's most destitute families. With monthly salaries between \$800 to \$1200 a month, the families struggle to stay housed and feed their children. Work in the sweatshops is seasonal, leaving families for periods of time with little income.

All children in Las Familias' after-school and out-of-school programs live in households surviving on income below the poverty line.

Wednesday, Revised

THE REV. WILLIAM STANLEY

Did you know that here at St. Cross we worship as a community on days other than Sunday? Have you ever attended our weekly liturgy on Wednesday nights at 7PM?

If you answered "no" to one or both of these questions, consider this article as a personal invitation! All churches have cherished traditions, and St. Cross is no different. Just last month we witnessed one of our most beloved: the annual Christmas Pageant. Many others, of course, come to mind. For a smaller group of us, one of them is our Wednesday Evening Eucharist.



Each week this faithful group gathers to worship. As is the case anytime we gather, we pray not just for those gathered, but on behalf of the wider community. And an outward and visible sign of this larger connection is enacted each week at this service. Many St. Cross folks make use of the prayer cards found in the pews, alerting us on the clergy team of prayer requests and other pastoral realities. Each week those prayer cards are lifted up by those in attendance at the Wednesday evening service during the "prayers of the people" time. So in a very real way, these folks embody each week many of the joys and concerns of this wonderful community of souls we call St. Cross.

In keeping with this special vocation, the service has had a distinct flow and shape. Developed by past associates in my position here at St. Cross, the liturgy has remained unchanged for many years. After the Rev. Robin Denney and I came on board this summer, Rev. Rachel charged us with taking a fresh look at this service. And so we have. In this work we have sought to embody what we do in a lot of our work as priests: we seek to make God known more clearly amongst our community. We have sought to honor the traditions we received from the past while also finding new ways to listen for the whispers of the Spirit in our midst.

Practically speaking, the service will now take a more seasonal approach so prayers will shift as we move through the season after the Epiphany...into Lent, Holy Week, Easter, and beyond! We have drawn upon the rich diversity of resources at our disposal in the Episcopal family, as well as our larger Anglican Communion family. We hope you find it to be a refreshingly familiar experience to help you deepen your connection with God.














Annual Meeting January 28th
