
vidually and collective-

Ministry Spotlight: Family Promise

What is Family Promise of the South Bay?

Family Promise of the South Bay (FPSB) is a community-based approach to solving homelessness, engaging both the local community as well as houses of faith in an effort to combat family homelessness. Families receive a full complement of resources, services and training as they work towards their own stability and self-reliance.

Families entering the emergency shelter program stay as the guests of congregations throughout the South Bay. As a support congregation, St. Cross is paired with Good Shep-

ard Lutheran Church (Torrance), which serves as the host church. Sup-



port Congregations strengthen the network by providing volunteers for host sites and the Family Day Center, supplies and food for the families, and in some cases, financial support for families when they graduate from the program.

Sacristy comes from the Latin meaning "sacred" and is the room that the Altar Guild uses to store the vestments, altar linens and vessels, oils, cleaning materials, etc. for preparing the church for services. The Vestry is the room where the clergy vest and keep their vestments. Its name came from the old days when the room was used for meetings of the vestry (church board of trustees/directors) as well as the vesting of the clergy. Today sometimes small groups meet in our Vestry.


